




## Middle School


## High School

### *Tyler Johnson Was Here*

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Although the idea had been around for a long time before then, the first *formal* Mother's Day celebration in the U.S. was held 110 years ago this year, on May 10, 1908, at St. Andrew's Methodist Episcopal Church in Grafton, W.Va.

On that day, Sunday school teacher Anna Jarvis held a memorial for her late mother, a peace activist who had given aid to soldiers on both sides of the Civil War. By the time Pres. Woodrow Wilson proclaimed the second Sunday in May a national holiday in 1914, Ms. Jarvis' Mother's Day movement had already swept most states.

Today, Mother's Day is always the second Sunday in May in both the U.S. and Canada. Through the years, sending a card, making a phone call, providing breakfast in bed, taking mom (or grandma) out to dinner—all these and more have been traditional ways of blessing the women who are so central to our lives and families. But even those of us with absent mothers can honor the spirit of the day by remembering those who have nurtured us and helped us grow, whether they are actual mothers or not. Mothers, grandmothers, educators, community leaders—they all deserve our thanks for providing the "mothering" in our lives. To them we say, Thank you—and Happy Mother's Day!
